Sheri has a strong relationship with the Boys and Girls executive Director Zane Smith and Susan Wells of the TIL Program.

The collaboration between them has produced an internship involving 3 alumni of the TIL Program currently living in Bakersfield. The trio will be working in the after-school program assisting with youth development and activities while obtaining important job skills.

1st Annual TC Student Research Conference



The 1st Annual Taft College Student Research Conference, sponsored by the Taft College Foundation, was held on March 18th in the Cougar Room. Nineteen students submitted their original work for inclusion in the conference. The audience was treated to a variety of research and reporting styles on topics ranging from cellular respiration to student-created historical videographies and presentations of student collected oral histories.

The submissions were grouped into five different categories and rated within each category by upper division undergraduate judges from CSU, Bakersfield. The three highest rated submissions by category were awarded monetary prizes to accompany the knowledge gained through the process. A good time was had by all as audience and presenters expressed their surprise at being interested in all the presentations regardless of topic. As one audience member said, "I came for the history and thought biology



would be boring. This conference showed me that all the areas are really interesting!" Women's Softball



Administrative Services Update:

2016-17 Budget Process

Administrative Services is busy with budget preparation for the 2016-17 academic year. Currently the budget figures for each area are being compiled to form the preliminary budget, which will be presented for approval to the Board of Trustees in June. Vice Presidents are working with budget managers to estimate expenditure costs for the upcoming year. The spring semester apportionment attendance report will be submitted in April. This report is part of the determination of the apportionment per student enrolled full time as set by the State. By the end of April, the District will receive the update to employee health benefit costs.

These steps will assist in the preparation in advance of the Governor's final revised budget in May to align District finances with the state's allocations for the upcoming year. The Governor releases these revisions each May, at which time the District will work with departments and strategic groups on campus to finalize budget requests to start the 2016-17 fiscal year. Governor Brown's proposed budget in January included money to be built-in permanently for Career/Technical Education, as well as for deferred maintenance/instructional equipment costs. While the state's budget is showing growth, Governor


Brown's budget is built conservatively to prepare for any future conditions that could affect educational spending.

Facilities

The District is currently set to open bids in early April for a new Student Center Building. The Student Center is included in the Master Facilities Plan and in Measure A funding. Once a bid is accepted and the Board of Trustees has approved the contractor, the project will begin the first phase of construction. This first phase will focus on utility infrastructure to existing facilities so that construction does not slow down our busy campus when the contractor begins the demolition/construction process. The Student Center will include the bookstore, cafeteria, and a student common area with ASB offices.

TC's Adrian Agundez Receives CISOA Award



Congratulations to TC's Director of Information Services Adrian Agundez for receiving the CISOA (Chief Information Services Officers Association) Technology Excellence Award at the recent annual 3CBG (CCC Banner Group) Conference held in Anaheim. The nomination was made by Dr. Eric Bérubé, Coordinator of Institutional Research and Planning. Dr. Bérubé focused Adrian's nomination on his development of the TC Technology Master Plan that is fully integrated with the College's Educational Master Plan and Strategic Action Plan. The 2012/13 - 2016/17 Technology Master Plan, which was recently updated and implemented, provides a 5-year blueprint for advancing the use

of technology in support of student learning at Taft College. The ambitious plan has been responsible for keeping Taft College on the forefront of technology use in the California Community College system and has immensely contributed to student success and employee morale.

Dr. Bérubé included his observation, "After working in higher education for almost 30 years at numerous institutions, I have seen a lot of 'master plans' come and go. Rarely do they live up to their intentions. However, under Adrian's leadership, Taft College's Technology Master Plan has truly been a 'living document' and roadmap to improving the already excellent technological infrastructure at Taft College. The Plan was well thought out and well implemented. Adrian's leadership style has been one to not only increase morale at Taft College, but has truly been focused on student and employee success. I believe his team deserves to be recognized for their efforts in helping Taft College's students achieve their educational goals." Adrian acknowledged his staff and fellow employees for their contributions to the overall technology effort.


