

Construction News

The Facilities Master Plan for 2112-2017 is nearly complete and has been reviewed by the Governance Council. It will be reviewed by the West Kern Community College District Board of Trustees at its December 13, 2012 meeting. Consistent progress is being made on the Transition to Independent Living project with about a 70 percent completion as of 11-27-12. We are currently planning on beginning work in December on Phase 3 of the parking lot project in order to complete work by January 22, 2013 prior to the start of the spring term. The entire TIL project is still scheduled to be complete in the first quarter of 2013.

Planning continues for Dorm renovations and a new student center. The Dorm project drawings are currently at the State for review. This project is scheduled to start by mid-2013. The student center project design is nearly complete and will be ready for state review in the near future.

Registration for Spring 2013 started in mid-November as priority groups began early registration. As of November 27th, 363 students have enrolled for the Spring 2013 term. Registration for continuing matriculation students begins December 3. Returning/former students and new student registration begins December 12th. Open registration begins on December 19th.

Instructional Program Updates

QFS Sponsored Adjunct Workshop, Fall 2012: Kamala Carlson and Jessica Grimes facilitated the second Adjunct Workshop for English and ESL faculty, sponsored by the Quest for Success (QFS) grant. Its purpose was to conduct a mini-study on strengthening continuity within the English and ESL Basic Skills sequence. Adjunct instructors were guided through the process of aligning course SLOs with writing prompts while applying teaching strategies to provoke students' critical thinking. This semester-length project culminated with participants submitting a portfolio of assignments that were classroom tested.

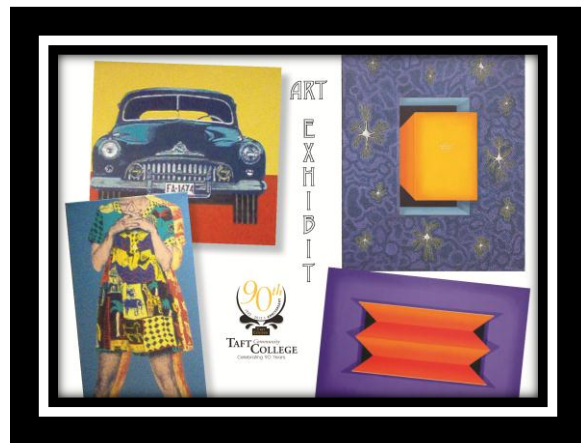
Participants, reflecting on the evolution of their teaching, were effusive about the benefits of the workshop. ESL instructor Vickie La Clare noted, "As a new instructor, I had big holes in my understanding of the progression of classes, the expectations for each and where ESL 600/700 fit into that. The workshop assignments were practical and useful immediately." English instructor Tanna Rozar stated, "I have already found myself referring back to it to review curriculum guidelines or to just look at example assignments. It was actually fun to try and come up with interesting topics and find good readings for the students." Danielle Harris, English instructor notes that "Everything that I now do in my classes blossomed from the seeds of discussion and ideas shared during the workshops." Sounds like the workshop was a huge success!

Dyer at Bard: In early November, Professor Geoffrey Dyer visited Bard College's Delano campus to speak with their Master of Arts in Teaching students. Dyer delivered a lecture on the poet Robert Duncan, a Bakersfield native associated with the San Francisco Renaissance and Black Mountain School Poets, and one of Dyer's special interests. After lecturing on Duncan and analyzing Duncan's work, Dyer coached the graduate students through a guided writing exercise. The students and their professor, Julia Bloch, have submitted their work to the Taft College student-edited literary publication, *A Sharp Piece of Awesome*.

News from the Art Department

The Taft College Art Gallery is proudly displaying the work of two Taft College alumni, Jim Campbell and Larry Jason. Both attended Taft College in the mid-60s. Jim also played basketball for Taft College. Larry Jason is still a resident of Taft. The exhibit runs through December 14th.

Taft College adjunct art faculty member Nano Rubio was the winner of the first annual More Family Foundation (MFF) grant. His work, entitled "Get Lucid," impressed the MFF grant team. Nano will not only be awarded a solo project room show at Mark Moore Gallery (Culver City, CA), but he will also receive \$1,000 in funding. According to the grant organizers, "After reviewing numerous submissions and 5790 projects nominated exhibition artists, Rubio's paintings stood out as an incredible display of innovation and process-oriented practice."
